Why is Waste Sorting Confusing?

- All cities and all waste management companies have slightly different guidelines
- **Cities right next to each other could have different waste management companies meaning** that they don't follow the same sorting guidelines
- When you move to a new place, you may have to relearn what waste goes in each category

Thankfully, many of the basic rules are the same across the country and we will review them...

Lead with WHY We can teach people HOW to sort their waste, but if they don't Most waste we generate is sent to the landfill (65% in 2017!) Sorting incorrectly is worse than just throwing waste in the

- understand why it's important they won't do it
- Trash
- When trash is mixed into recycling and compost, the real recyclables and compostables get contaminated
- Waste that could have had a second life ends up in the landfill



Recycling Basics

- Must be CLEAN AND DRY
- No food or residue of any kind
- Focus on 5 categories:
 - Paper
 - Cardboard
 - **Glass**
 - Metal (some exceptions) Plastic (some exceptions)





Composting Basics

- Anything you can eat (all food) can be composted
- Paper/ cardboard products with food on them (without a shiny plastic coating) can be composted
- Yard waste can be composted





Trash Basics

- All "flimsy" plastic (food wrappers, plastic bags)
- Bubble wrap
- Styrofoam
- Diapers
- All other garbage





Hard to Recycle Materials:

These items cannot go in the recycling or compost and must be recycled in a special way. Each city has different resources depending on the area and some spread all across King County. Refer to the pink Hard to Recycle Handout!

- Plastic Film (Plastic Bags)
- Styrofoam
- Batteries
- Scrap Metal
- Lightbulbs
- Textiles



- Items must be bigger than 3 inches in order to pass through sorting machine *(items smaller than your fist are NOT recyclable)*
- Items that are mixed materials are NOT recyclable *(ex: both paper and plastic in* one item)
- Small amount of tape, paper, or plastic on recyclables are okay (ex: labels and tape on boxes)
- Only certain kinds of plastic can be recycled (Hard vs Soft Plastics) Refer to Plastic Identification Code handout
- Do not throw away electronics, hazardous waste (chemicals), or medical waste
- NO PLASTIC, GLASS, OR METAL in compost



What if I dont know the answer?

- Guidelines are different in every city it's hard to make generalizations
- Refer to the specific city sorting guide on poster
